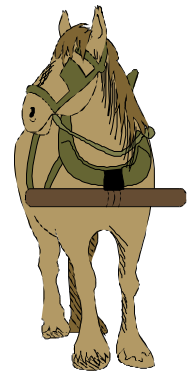


TIVERTON BARGE & EXETER

The Grand Western Canal was built in 1814, for primary use of the lime trade. Horse-Drawn tub-boats worked for over 130 years conveying stone from the quarries, which was then fired into lime for farming and house building. Today the canal is a Country Park; home to one of the last remaining Horse-Drawn Barges in the UK and an abundance of flora and wildlife.
