SUNDAY – We leave Bretonside at 9am and make our way to the cathedral city of Worcester. The River Severn runs through the middle of the city, overlooked by the twelfth-century Cathedral. The city centre is largely pedestrianised with plenty of places to eat and drink, from top-flight restaurants, traditional cafes, ancient pubs or modern coffee shops. We continue our journey to our hotel arriving late afternoon, in plenty of time to check in and relax before our evening meal is served.

MONDAY – This morning we visit the vast medieval fortress of Kenilworth Castle, one of the most spectacular castle ruins in England. The ruins are best known as the home of Robert Dudley, the great love of Queen Elizabeth I. Dudley created an ornate palace here to impress his beloved Queen in 1575. The newly re-created Elizabethan Garden, lost for 400 years, is now open to visitors once more. A paradise for garden lovers, wander through this sumptuous landscape as Queen Elizabeth I would have done herself.

TUESDAY – Today we visit Stratford upon Avon introducing you to a market town with more than 800 years of history. William Shakespeare was born, lived and died here and his influence is everywhere. This afternoon we include a boat trip on the river which will include a cream tea aboard the “Countess of Evesham”.

WEDNESDAY – After breakfast we begin our journey home. We visit the beautiful village of Broadway nestling beneath the Worcestershire hills of the Cotswolds. We continue our journey to Cheltenham, England's most complete Regency town. Regency town houses, characterised by intricate ironwork balconies and painted stucco facades, line the historic promenade, squares and terraces, with their award-winning gardens and impressive range of stylish shops and restaurants. We leave here at 3.30pm arriving back in Plymouth approx 7pm.
