SCOTTISH HIGHLANDS

SUNDAY - We depart Bretonside at 6am and start our journey north, making several comfort stops along the way. We anticipate arriving in Aviemore early evening where you can enjoy your first meal and relax and unwind after your long journey.

MONDAY - We will travel through "Monarch of the Glen" country today to Fort William. Weather permitting there will be an opportunity to take a cable car up Aonach Mor (neighbour of Ben Nevis - not incl. in price). We then drive along the "Great Glen" alongside the shores of Loch Ness and Inverness back to our hotel.

TUESDAY - Today's journey is to Blair Castle, the ancient seat of the Dukes and Earls of Atholl. The castle enjoys one of Scotland's finest settings in the heart of Highland Perthshire. With its roots in the 13th century, Blair Castle's history extends over some 740 years. Our journey back to the hotel takes us to the "Queens View", one of the outstanding beauty spots in all of Scotland where a panorama of lake and mountain scenery stretches westwards as far as the Glen Coe hills.

WEDNESDAY - Today we take you on a scenic tour over the Highland mountains of the Grampian's through Tomintoul and the River Dee to Ballater, a delightful 'Victorian' town in the centre of Royal Deeside. We then pass Balmoral Castle, visiting the delightful "royal" parish church at Craithie. We continue on to Braemar, through the Spittle of Glenshee and Pitlochry, returning to our hotel.

THURSDAY - Today we travel the short distance to Aviemore. We will drive up to the base station of the Cairngorm mountain, where there will be opportunity to travel on the funicular rail to the top station (not incl. in price). On our return to Newtonmore we visit the Highland Folk Museum and see the working conditions of earlier Highland people. Visitors to this living history Museum can learn how our Scottish Highland ancestors lived, how they built their homes, how they tilled the soil and how they dressed from the 1700's to the present day. It also offers an opportunity to explore a beautiful natural setting, home to red squirrels.

FRIDAY - Sadly we must make our way home today. Plenty of comfort stops will be made along the way, including a visit to Gretna Green (time to re-new those vows?). We will arrive back in Bretonside late evening (approx. 10pm).
