**THURSDAY** – We leave Bretonside at 8am and after a coffee stop make our way to Burton upon Trent the largest town in the National Forest, internationally known as the capital of British brewing. The River Trent and the Trent and Mersey canal wind their way majestically through the town. Burton upon Trent is a premier shopping centre, boasting three excellent shopping centres, with a good mix of specialist shops and the country's leading retailers. We then complete our journey to our hotel in Harrogate arriving late afternoon.

One of England's finest Baroque mansions, and home to the Howard family for over 300 years, Castle Howard is a magnificent 18th-century residence set within 1,000 acres of breathtaking landscape. You will be able to enjoy the world-renowned collections, stunning, relax amid idyllic gardens and enjoy the woodland and lakeside walks.

**MONDAY** – After breakfast, we begin our journey home. We will visit the National Memorial Arboretum Created in 1997, the National Memorial Arboretum is a special place that remembers those who have served, and continue to serve, our nation in many different ways. With some 50,000 trees already planted, and 200 dedicated memorials established on the site, the Arboretum is a living tribute that will forever acknowledge the personal sacrifices made by the armed and civil services of this country.
