

Route branded Enviro 200s for Plymouth Citybus

Three 10.7 metre Alexander Dennis Enviro 200s have entered service with Plymouth Citybus for use on Route 34 between Plymouth City Centre and Derriford Hospital via the prestigious City Waterfront.

The vehicles have been partly funded by The South West Regional Development Agency using section 106 moneys that have been sourced through their involvement in the historic Royal William Yard complex which is being converted from its former use as a food supply facility for the Royal Navy to a “mixed use” residential and retail centre.

The vehicles carry route branding for Service 34 depicting the Royal William Yard and other popular places served by this commercial route and the livery has been designed by Yorkshire based Samantha Beeley.

A special launch was held at the Royal William Yard on Friday 20 October to introduce the new buses. Deputy Lord Mayor of The City of Plymouth and Citybus Driver Brian Vincent formally handed over the vehicles to Citybus Chairman Ron Simmonds and South West of England RDA Operations & Development Manager David James, the Deputy Lord Mayor then took one of the new buses on a test drive.
